The implications of downgrading this road would include: The implementation of weight restrictions. Local County Councils having greater jurisdiction over the management of the road. The removal of the road from route finders/Satnavs. Currently over 11,000 vehicles travel along the A4146 a day. McCann Development

Following the DLP/McCann Public Exhibition Cllr Wilkinson analysed the results of the Council's survey asking for Parishioners thoughts regarding the proposed housing development in Edlesborough. This action was publicly shared on Facebook on 9th February 2015. Cllr Williams explained that it is not normal practise to share information if this kind through Facebook however given the momentum of the situation this was the quickest way to share the information publicly.

The predominant concerns expressed by residents are:

- The size of the development and overall number of houses proposed

- Lack of capacity at the local GP surgery
- Lack of capacity at the local school
- A worsening of the existing sewerage and drainage problems
- Additional traffic congestion/parking problems

Following the concern expressed by a number of residents about the sewerage problems, the Developer informed us at the end of the evening that they intend to commission an engineering study of the village sewerage system in an effort to identify the extent of the problems and to identify possible solutions.

DLP/McCann have forwarded a copy of their Exhibition Feedback Summary to the Parish Council. All Councillors have received a copy of this document and parts of it were shared at the meeting. The document cited the same concerns as the Parish Council:

- The size of the development and overall number of houses proposed
- Lack of capacity at the local GP surgery
- Lack of capacity at the local school
- A worsening of the existing sewerage and drainage problems
- Additional traffic congestion/parking problems

After the Public Exhibition DLP/McCann stated that they would commission an engineer to investigate the history of and current sewerage problems in Edlesborough. Cllr Wilkinson has met with this engineer and shared extensive information with him regarding the sewerage issues.

Cllr Williams proposed that given that the Council's survey confirmed the Council's belief that the majority of the Parish would be opposed to a development of this size in Edlesborough that when a planning application is submitted for this development the Parish Council will oppose it. All Cllrs agreed.

Cllr Williams went on to explain that given the current situation regarding AVDC's lack of housing plan the Parish Council expect that some form of development will be allowed on the proposed site. Cllr Williams therefore proposed that the Parish Council will work with DLP/McCann to try to ensure that the village get the best benefit possible from the developers and development. All Cllrs agreed.

At this time McCann have stated that they do intend to build the development themselves and will not be looking forward to selling the site if they gain planning permission.
