Green Spaces in the Parish

Unfortunately EPC is receiving an increasing number of complaints about dog fouling on Edlesborough Green, Dagnall Rec and the Allotments.

EPC reminds all parishioners to:

• Keep <u>dogs under control. If your dog does not have excellent recall it must be kept on lead</u> to ensure that is does not spoil the enjoyment of other parishioners.

Please Clean up after your dog!

Buckinghamshire Council is responsible for the emptying of the dog bins in Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall. These are currently scheduled to be emptied on a Friday.

- If a bin is overflowing please call the number on the bin and quote the reference number on the bin.
- If a bin is broken please inform EPC as soon as possible to enable a swift repair or bin replacement as necessary.
- Now that the evenings are darker please be extra vigilant when walking your dog to ensure you clear up after them.

Improvements to the Children's Play Area on Edlesborough Green

At the time of writing this report the Planning Inspector site visit has been rescheduled for October. EPC hopes to receive a swift decision on the application after this visit. EPC representatives have been invited to attend the visit. The Inspector will not accept any representations on the merits of the application at the site visit, although he/she may ask factual questions to confirm his/her understanding of the physical features of the site.

<u>MVAS</u>

Unfortunately EPC is currently experiencing difficulties acquiring the required licence from Buckinghamshire Council to install the required supporting poles for the new Mobile Vehicle Activated Signs (MVAS) within the parish. Once this issue has been resolved EPC will be able to deploy the three MAVS units at 12 different locations in the Parish.

The purpose of these signs is to remind drivers of the speed limit and to encourage them to reduce their speed through our villages. Data collected by the signs can also be used as evidence for other traffic calming measures.

<u>Salt Bins</u>

The responsibility for filling these bins is with Transport for Buckinghamshire. When supplies are running low a refill request should be submitted via their website <u>https://www.fixmystreet.buckscc.gov.uk/</u> It is more appropriate if a parishioner living close to the salt bin makes the request but in practice anyone can make the request. *EDaN Community Car Service*

EPC Small Grant Scheme

Two organisations have already benefitted from this scheme.

This is a great opportunity for local groups, local charities and local organisations to get a grant of up to £500 in this new scheme.

The main terms of the grant are very straightforward.

- The purpose for which the grant is made must be in the interest of Edlesborough Parish that covers the residents of Edlesborough. Dagnall and Northall.
- EPC will determine the size of the award up to a maximum of £500.
- We will not award funds for activities that have already taken place.
- Any publicity covering the activity funded must mention EPC's involvement.
- Following the award, recipients must make a short presentation at the Annual Parish Meeting.

Applications will be reviewed at any time during the year and awards to successful applications made in each quarter beginning in April of each year. The total funding available is limited.


Council Meetings
