New Litter and Recycling Bins

Sadly, there has been a noticeable increase in litter on Edlesborough Green near the new play equipment. Two new bins have now been installed by the new play equipment; one for litter and one for waste that can be recycled. Please remind your children to use these bins for their waste/litter. The blue bins are for:

- Paper & Cardboard
- Empty Plastic Bottles
- Empty Cans
- Waxed Cartons
- Please <u>do not</u> put any food or liquids into the bin as this will contaminate the waste and prevent it from being recycled.
- The green bins are for rubbish that cannot be recycled.
- Please <u>do not</u> put dog waste into either the green or blue litter bins.
- Dog waste <u>must</u> be disposed of in the red dog waste bins.

If you find that any of the bins are full, please take a short walk to the next bin or take your litter home with you. *Let's all work together to keep our villages tidy and litter free!*

Buckinghamshire Council is the Highways Authority and as such they have control over what traffic calming measures can be put in place on Buckinghamshire Roads. Buckinghamshire Council's policy is one of education opposed to punishment. More information can be viewed at

How does EPC help combat speeding in the Parish?

EPC has invested in new wheelie bin stickers which will be distributed to homes on roads where parishioners have raised concerns about speeding.

SPEEDWATCH

What is Speedwatch?

- Speedwatch is a scheme managed by Thames Valley Police (TVP), promoted by Buckinghamshire Council, supported by EPC, and delivered by volunteers.
- Locations for monitoring speed are selected from sites suggested by the community, based on where there is most local concern about speeding traffic, or the impact of speed. These locations must be approved by TVP.
- The location, date, time, speed and registration numbers of speeding vehicles are recorded. This information is shared with TVP.
- Speedwatch operates across the entire TVP area monitoring the speed of vehicles. This means that if a registration is regularly reported to TVP, the information is collated and TVP can then take the following actions:

The three Mobile Vehicle Activated Signs (MVAS) devices are now deployed around the Parish. There are 13 approved locations for these devices. The purpose of these signs is to remind drivers of the speed limit and to encourage them to reduce their speed through our villages. Data collected by the signs can also be used as evidence for other traffic calming measures.



- Warning letters are sent out by Thames Valley Police to the registered keepers stating that their vehicle has been reported as speeding.
- The first letter is a warning letter. The second is a stronger letter.
- If Speedwatch activity evidences a speed problem, this may result in enforcement by the Police.
- For Speedwatch to be effective in our Parish we need more volunteers who are prepared to be trained and are available to spare some time to use the Speedwatch video capture device.

<u>Salt Bins</u>

The responsibility for filling these bins is with Transport for Buckinghamshire. When supplies are running low a refill request should be submitted via their website <u>https://www.fixmystreet.buckscc.gov.uk/</u>. It is more appropriate if a parishioner living close to the salt bin makes the request but in practice anyone can make the request.
