Open Forum	A parishioner asked what the Councils response to the planning application 17/02539/AOP - Land Off Slicketts Lane And Dove House Close Edlesborough would be. - Cllr Wilkinson explained that at present the application is for outline planning permission; this means the application requests permission to develop the land in principle and outlines how the development will be accessed. Details pertaining to the type of homes etc. will be determined if and when a full application is submitted. The Council will be commenting on the current access proposals.					
	A parishioner asked what the Councils response to the planning application 17/02222/APP Land at rear of Good Intent, Edlesborough would be. - Cllr Wilkinson explained that the Council had discussed the application prior to the meeting due to the response date and that they would be ratifying their decision at this meeting. He explained that the Council had opposed the application on the grounds of housing mix, vehicular access and off street parking not being in line with the policies in the developing Neighbourhood Plan. Cllr Wilkinson explained that currently the regulations state that roads need to be between 4.8m and 5.5m wide. Good Intent is 5.5m. AVDC will be guided by Bucks CC Highways when considering access issues and road layout. The Edlesborough Parish Neighbourhood Plan would like roads to be 5.5m in width and also state that the Good Intent development should be accessed via Cow Lane as the visibility at Good Intent/High Street is very poor and hazardous.

Matters Arising District & County Councillors Reports	County Cllr Anne Wight Marsworth Airfield The Development Control hearing to discuss the retrospective planning application for a change from empty skip storage to waste processing on the Marsworth Airfield site took place on 19th June. I spoke at the hearing to object to the application, along with Peter Brazier, chairman of Mentmore parish council, who represented several villages in the local area, Richard Brake, chairman of Marsworth parish council, and Pier Thomas from the Campaign Against Lorry Menace (C.A.L.M.) group. Despite the many objections, the planning application was approved, subject to routeing restrictions. Freight Strategy The Freight Strategy public consultation closed on 6th July and had good participation at 1092 responses. Another public consultation is planned for the autumn. I had a meeting recently on Freight Strategy with Paul Irwin, Deputy Cabinet Member for Transportation, who is heading up the initiatives at BCC, and district councillor Chris Poll. We
	discussed the B488 and the A4146 in particular in the hopes that Paul may be able to take those issues forward when formulating the Freight Strategy. **Update regarding EDL1/1, EDL 23/1, and EDL 24/1** It appears that EDL 24/1 on the map is the section which Edlesborough Parish Council is responsible for maintaining, whereas section EDL1/1 and EDL23/1, which the parish has been cutting, are not the responsibility of the parish. **BCC e-newsletter** The first of the new BCC e-newsletters for the new term was sent out recently. I plan to feature photos of our village and local community events in as many BCC newsletters as possible. It is circulated to more than 18,000 people, and is also sent out to 600 town and parish contacts throughout the county. Hence, I am hoping to be able to illustrate what interesting and thriving villages we have in here in Ivinghoe Division! If you have not received an e-copy let me know and I will make sure you are added to the circulation list. **Upcoming Dates**
	The next Local Area Forum will be on 27 July at 7pm in the Main Hall of the Cottesloe School in Wing. <u>District Cllr Chris Poll</u> Spoke about the meeting with BCC officers which Anne Wight facilitated regarding the Freight Strategy. The main objective was to gain support for the idea that Ivinghoe division has a unique and pressing problem not felt by most



	other areas in Bucks. They were responsive to our comments and will have more to say at the LAF meeting next week 27-7-17. The VALP scrutiny meeting went ahead despite not having the full draft submission document owing to an external supplier not having completed their report to the timescale expected. The next VALP scrutiny will be on the 26th September where the final draft will be examined by members. Cllr Poll explained that the Wycombe, Chiltern and South Bucks plans are also delayed and are currently 6-8 weeks behind VALP.

	has put the following statement on their website and Facebook site, it will also appear in the next edition of Focus.	
	" <u>Dogs on Edlesborough Green</u>	
	Edlesborough Parish Council and AVDC have both received complaints regarding dogs on Edlesborough Green.	
	EPC remind parishioners that the Byelaw No 4 states the following:	
	"A person shall not cause or suffer any dog belonging to him or in his charge to remain in the ground unless such dog	
	be and continue to be under proper control and effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any person and from worrying or disturbing any animal."	
	Some people interpret that to mean all dogs must be on a lead at all times, but what constitutes effective restraint	
	depends to some extent on the dog and the owner. An unruly dog on a longish lead can cause problems, whereas a	
	well-trained dog that responds immediately to its owner's commands can be effectively restrained without the use of a lead.	
	The problem with any byelaw of course is enforcement. Thames Valley Police have provided the following information:
