### The Annual Parish Meeting of Edlesborough Parish Council

The Annual Meeting of Edlesborough Parish Council was held on 17<sup>th</sup> May in Edlesborough Memorial Hall. The Council elected a new Chair, Cllr Scott Mineikis and a new Vice Chair, Cllr Alan Green. The Council thanked Cllr Alan Williams for his sterling work as Chair over the past few years. Cllr Williams will continue as a Cllr representing the Ward of Edlesborough.

### Thames Valley Police Report

PCSO Jackie Dodson attended the Council meeting on the 17<sup>th</sup> May and gave the following crime figures for the year 2017-18:

- ➤ Theft from Motor Vehicle = 8
- ➤ Theft of Motor Vehicle = 2
- ➤ Burglary Dwelling = 3
- Burglary Non Dwelling = 7
- $\rightarrow$  Theft = 4
- $\rightarrow$  ASB = 0
- Criminal Damage = 10

(These range from School Gates being damaged, Glue in Padlocks, Damage caused to Vehicles, and Fencing Damaged in Neighbour Disputes.)

There has been an increase in the number of crimes since the year before.

PCSO Dodson also asked that parishioners report crimes, anti-social behaviour, vandalism, etc. to Thames Valley Police via 101. Sharing information on social media may be helpful to the community but it does not give the Police a true reflection of the issues in the Parish. She confirmed that if more crimes are reported there will be a greater police presence in the Parish. TVP use the information from reported crimes to inform the officers on duty of where to focus their patrols.

EPC's end of year accounts have been completed, internally audited and approved by the full Council at the May EPC meeting. They have now been submitted to the external auditor PKF Littlejohn LLP for external audit.

EPC are currently working with BCC and the Local Area Forum to carry out a Traffic Calming Feasibility Study in identified areas in Edlesborough and Dagnall.

#### Parking Issues in the Parish

Once again the Council asks Parishioners to park considerately in the Parish. Please avoid parking on the white lines and words near the school, shops and in Summerleys. These road markings are in place to help keep our parishioners safe.



The Council also asks that drivers DO NOT park on the pavements or grass verges in and around the villages. Parking in this way inconveniences and endangers users of the pavements & the Council contractors.
