Anne Thompson's Young People's Cup for Excellence

The Anne Thompson Young People's Cup for Excellence is an award presented by EPC to a young person in the Parish who has come to the attention of the Council. The cup may be awarded for excellent achievement, raising awareness, contributing to the local community or for another reason that makes the young person stand out to the Council.

This year EPC awarded the Anne Thompson Young People's Cup for Excellence to Mia Gregory. Mia lives in Edlesborough and has come to the Councils attention for her achievement in football.

Mia started playing football for EB Lions at the start of 2015. She was the only girl in a boys' team but from the start she loved it, she was very keen to develop her game and proved to be a quick learner. She had real positivity in training and enjoyed playing. In her third game when she scored a free kick from distance - it went right into the top corner and was met with stunned silence, before a massive cheer. After that there was no looking back as she developed into a brilliant player, using her pace and strength to score goals and her passing and vision to set up others. It was great education to some opposition players who didn't think a girl should be stronger, quicker and better than them - she took all challenges in her stride.



Across her three seasons with EB Lions she finished top scorer twice, scoring 63 goals from 63 games. Along with this successful score sheet Mia was also a very good team player, she created numerous opportunities for others so was very popular with the rest of our players, winning the Players' Player award twice and Coaches' Player award in the other season.

In 2017 she was selected to play and train with Bedford ACC (Bedford Advanced Coaching Centre). This was the first time she had played in an all-girls team and despite being a year younger than the others she really enjoyed playing other counties around the country.

At the end of the 2017-2018 season Mia made the painful decision to leave EB Lions and take up a place at Watford FC on the Elite Player Programme. The transition initially was a hard one as she was leaving behind the team she had grown up with but most importantly she was leaving the manager, Gurdeep Singh that had been such a massive influence on developing her into the player she had become. Mia has loved being in an all-girls team this year. The team have won the League Cup and the Division 1 title this year as well as several tournaments this summer. She also finished top goal scorer with over 40 goals this season.

Football has been great for Mia it has given her confidence, a drive to succeed and a chance to work with others outside the classroom environment. None of it would have been possible without the dedication of

the volunteers that have given their time up to coach including her EB Lions' coaches, Gurdeep Singh, Mark Siddons, Adrian Bush, her brother, Kai and her parents Sara and Jim Gregory who support her at training sessions and matches.

Special Projects within the Parish

EPC are pleased to report that after lots of hard work, despite disappointing responses from AVDC and EBPC, the Council has been able to work with Dr Jones and Dr Bell to fund the extension to the Edlesborough Surgery Car Park.

It is hoped that as well as providing additional parking spaces for the surgery patients this extension will help alleviate some of the parking congestion on Cow Lane, Edlesborough.

District Cllr Chris Poll

District Cllr Chris Poll gave the following report at the June EPC meeting:

"I am delighted to report that the decision on the Swallowfields development has now been made. This, along with others, was long overdue. I would suggest this conclusion was not merely down to my appeal to our planning department, as the same issue was being repeated right across the Vale and I am sure others made similar representations. Thankfully the issues are resolved for the moment and your NDP will reduce the possibility of further speculative development applications.

Our first Shadow Authority meeting has been held at which we agreed our constitution. Much in line with the existing 5 councils own constitutions it was unanimously approved. The possibility of any group of councillors requesting that establishment of a Working Group committee was agreed and in that respect I, along with the other council Chairmen and Vice Chairmen, will seek to compile a report for consideration regarding the future civic duty role in the new Buckinghamshire Council."
