Edlesborough Pavilion

Edlesborough Parish Council is pleased to announce that the long awaited Edlesborough Pavilion is now complete.

EPC have signed a 25 year lease with ECSC who have now taken over the running of the building. Many parishioners have already been able to enjoy the wonderful new parish facility.

Edlesborough Green

Edlesborough Green is now being widely used by parishioners for dog walks, exercise, and carefully coordinated sports activities.

EPC reminds all parishioners to:

- Keep <u>dogs under control</u>. If your dog does not have excellent recall it must be kept on lead to ensure that is does not spoil the enjoyment of Edlesborough Green for other users.
- Use the litter bins provided or preferably take all rubbish and recycling home.

Clean up after your dog!

- Buckinghamshire Council is responsible for the emptying of the dog bins in Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall.
- These are scheduled to be emptied every Tuesday.
- Currently the telephone number displayed on the dog waste bins in the parish is no longer in use. Buckinghamshire Council who are responsible for the emptying and sanitising of the bins request that unemptied/overflowing bins are reported using the following link https://www.aylesburyvaledc.gov.uk/dog-waste-bins

- If a bin is overflowing please use another bin or take your dog waste home where it can be disposed of in your green general waste bin.
- Please DO NOT pile dog waste on top of full bins.

- Now that the evenings are darker please be extra vigilant when walking your dog to ensure you clear up after them.

EDaN Traffic Management and Speedwatch

Following recent site meetings, appropriate Speedwatch locations were identified and confirmed within the three villages. Cllr Williams will now complete work on submitting locations for flashing Mobile Vehicle Activation Signs (MVAS) to Buckinghamshire Council and a request to the Wing and Ivinghoe Community Board for funding for MVAS equipment.

Once purchased the MVAS equipment will be deployed at various locations around the parish. The data collected can then be shared with Thames Valley Police and Buckinghamshire Council to provide evidence in support of traffic calming requests. The Speedwatch video equipment collects individual speeding vehicle data that is passed to TVP for individual follow up.



The Wing and Ivinghoe Community Board will shortly be supplying a package of 20mph and No Idling advisory signs which can be displayed outside the schools within the Parish.

At the October Council meeting Council ratified their response to support Buckinghamshire Council Cllr Peter Cooper's request for support to lobby Buckinghamshire Council to allow parishes to apply for 20mph limits in specific locations within their parish.

Currently Buckinghamshire Council's stance on speeding vehicles is one of education rather than enforcement.

Salt Bins

The responsibility for filling these bins is with Transport for Buckinghamshire. When supplies are running low a refill request should be submitted via their website https://www.fixmystreet.buckscc.gov.uk/ It is more appropriate if a parishioner living close to the salt bin makes the request but in practice anyone can make the request.



EDaN Community Car Share Scheme

This is a group of local volunteers who support parishioners with journeys to hospital etc. The group been inactive due to Covid-19 and has now resumed.

EDaN Beautification Team

The EDaN Beautification team have purchased two benches for siting on the new pavilion patio area which will be dedicated to local parishioners.

Council commended the EDaN Beatification Team on their proposal for and subsequent purchase of three Prunus 'Accolade' trees on Edlesborough Green as part of the Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebration 'Green Canopy' initiative. These will be planted near the entrance to Edlesborough Pavilion car park. They will also

plant one tree in Northall in memory of Katherine Parker who was a very active member of the team.


The EDaN Beautification Team is running low on volunteers for the tidying and watering of these planters. Anyone interested in getting
