- The population is over 23,761
- Number of young people 9338
- 32% of children are overweight in year 6 and 34.4% of adults are obese
- 18.4% of all adults are physically inactive
- **8.9%** of children are living in poverty
- The overall crime rate is lower than average
- 5th highest community board for emergency admissions to hospital
- Risk of loneliness is higher in the Wing Ward than some parts of the local town
- **3206** residents living in households at higher risk of food poverty



Speed Indicator Devices: 5 parishes collaborated in the purchase of 12 Speed Indicator Devices. This allowed for a very good discount on the units themselves. The collaboration has also meant a good speed safety network amongst the board and knowledge sharing. Some parishes are already in agreements with neighbours on sharing the devices to further extend their use. The devices are solar powered which is great for the environment too.



Get Involved

Mental Health First Aiders: Mental Health First Aid training to school staff, to enable them to support the mental wellbeing of young people. This training is to be be delivered by Bucks Mind. The course qualifies delegates as Youth Mental Health First Aiders and will give delegates the skills to identify, understand and help someone who may be experiencing a mental health issue.

- The budget this year is £99,040
- Contributary funding is required for applications over £1000.
- The maximum amount that can be applied for is £15,000
- Small Grant Application for anything under £1000 in place
- New funding team in place who will administer applications
