Vehicle Crime Project

Due to a reported increase in vehicle related crime, the Community Safety team are running a vehicle crime project across Buckinghamshire which includes:

- Clear Car campaigns: Community Safety Officers (CSO's) and the local Neighbourhood Policing teams have visited a variety of car parks and noted down registration details of those cars displaying items on show, which could lead to a potential break in. Items on show have consisted of wallets, handbags, cash and much more! Owners who are spotted leaving valuables on show receive a crime prevention letter with advice and information on how to keep their vehicle safe. Remember – always keep your car clear!
- Keep an eye out on our social media pages for tips to keep your vehicle safe from crime.
- **Community Events:** Our CSOs will be attending various events in the community such as wellbeing events, education events and Community Action Days where vehicle crime prevention items and advice will be given out free of charge.
- Number plate screws project: CSO's have partnered with eight garages across
 Buckinghamshire with the aim of reducing number plate theft. You can attend
 selected garages and ask to have anti-tamper proof number plate screws installed
 for FREE on your vehicle. You will also be provided with an air freshener or ice
 scraper with crime prevention messaging on, a 'no tools left in van overnight' sticker
 (if relevant) and leaflets all displaying vehicle crime related messages.

Spring Crime

With Spring just around the corner, you may start planning to tidy your garden in preparation for the warmer months. Unfortunately, statistics show that there is often a spike in shed burglaries in the spring.

As the weather heats up, opportunistic thieves will start to look out for open windows, unsecured sheds, gardening tools and bikes that have been left out.



Here are a few simple tips to keep your shed and tools safe:

Clearly security mark all tools with your house number, name and postcode.

- When you are finished with your tools, lock them away in your shed. A ladder left out can be used to break into your house.
- Use a good quality padlock or mortice lock on the door of your shed.
- Make sure windows, hinges and hasp fittings are strong, as this can often be an entry point.
- Fit external, motion-activated security lighting.
- Lock bikes to a fixed structure.
- If your shed has a window, cover it up or obscure the view.
- Don't leave house doors/ windows open whilst in the garden, as an opportunistic thief might take advantage while you are busy in the garden.
- You could also consider defensive planting to prevent anyone coming into your garden; nature's own way to reduce crime. Criminals do not like climbing through prickly plants and hedges! They know that a small item of ripped clothing or blood can help the police identify them.

ATM Thefts

Thames Valley police have notified us that there is a current spate of distraction thefts at cash machines (ATMs) occurring across Buckinghamshire.

Suspects use a variety of different distraction techniques which can include; stating the victim has dropped money nearby, claiming the ATM is faulty and then assisting by pressing the cancel button, waving paper in front of the screen, or shouting at the victim.

Card trap devices have also been recorded as used; they are placed over the card slot of the ATM which prevents a person's card being released back to them.

Top tips to keep yourself safe:

- Look out for anything unusual on or around the machine If you see something suspicious do not use the machine and report it.
- Be aware of anyone hanging around the ATM or standing too close to you use another machine or ask them to stand back.
- Always cover the PIN pad before entering your PIN.
- Do not allow anyone to distract you whilst you are at the ATM.
- Put your card and money away immediately.

If you are suspicious or have any concerns – cancel your transaction, remove your card and report it to the police on 101 or online via Report a crime | Thames Valley Police

In the unfortunate event you become a victim of this crime, report it immediately to your card issuer to freeze your cards.



Be Waterwise

As we head towards warmer weather, we tend to see an increase in young people visiting outdoor spaces, especially where there is water. The water may look calm and appealing, however we would like to remind the public that there are many hidden dangers beneath the surface, such as:

 Cold water shock; this is your body's response to being suddenly immersed into water. Your body's reaction will affect your capability to move and may seriously affect your breathing and heart. It will also increase the difficulty in getting out of the water.

- Depth of the water; this regularly changes and is unpredictable
- Underwater objects; there are many hazards that you cannot see there could be a shopping trolley that has been discarded or plants that you could get entangled in
- Strong currents
- Uneven banks and riverbeds
- Water quality
- The height of the fall or jump if tombstoning (jumping from height e.g. from a bridge)

Safe Place scheme

Are you aware of our Safe Place Scheme? It's a scheme which aims to create confidence in members of the community when they are out and about in public. It gives vulnerable people a place to go if they are feeling lost, scared or confused when out in their local community.

Shops and businesses such as cafes, libraries and charity shops display a sticker in their window to show that staff are available to offer help or reassurance. Members of the scheme will sometimes carry a 'close contact' card which they can hand to the staff member, they will then call their chosen contact for them in a time of need.

At Buckinghamshire Fire and Rescue Service, your safety is our priority. The National Fire Chiefs Council (NFCC) reports that in 1987, only 9% of UK households had a working smoke alarm. Today, that figure has risen to approximately 90%, helping to save countless lives.

Despite this progress, many homes still have fire risks. To help you stay safe, we offer a free **Online Home Fire Safety Check** - a quick, easy-to-use tool providing personalised fire safety advice tailored to your home.

In just 15 minutes, this online service will guide you through:

- ✓ Ensuring smoke alarms are correctly placed and functioning.
- √ Planning a safe escape route in case of emergency
- ✓ Identifying potential fire risks in your home

If the results indicate a higher risk, you may be eligible for a free **Home Fire Safety Visit**, where our team can provide additional support.


This online service is available 24/7, making it perfect for those with busy schedules or anyone supporting elderly relatives or neighbours (with their consent).

Cold Callers

Cold callers showing up at your door can not only be a nuisance but can also be intimidating to some. Cold callers are uninvited people showing up at your door and trying to pressure you for information, money, to sell you things or to persuade you to get work done around your home.

If uninvited people show up at your door:

- Check who is there through a window or peep hole and don't feel obligated to answer or talk to them
- If you do talk to them, don't agree to anything on the spot
- Get quotes from other companies before deciding if work needs doing
- Never pay cash on your doorstep
- Report scammers to the authorities

Some people in Buckinghamshire who are susceptible to frequent unsolicited or nuisance callers at their door may be able to get a door camera for free from Buckinghamshire & Surrey trading standards. The camera is triggered by someone coming to your door and sends an alert to your smart phone.

Nuisance Phone Calls

Any kind of unwelcome phone call you receive. For example, market research and sales calls. Or criminals pretending to be from a bank, well-known company or government agency trying to get your personal and financial details.

Unfortunately, nuisance phone calls are on the increase. Many of them are scams that aim to con people out of money.

Some people will be eligible to apply for a 'TrueCall' device; which blocks unwanted phone calls to help give you peace and quiet at home, whilst allowing your friends, family and other trusted people to call you.
