Pebble/Pea Shingle Driveways


Council requests that residents with a pebble or peas shingle driveway regularly check for spillage onto the adjoining pavement. Pebbles and pea shingle on the pavement can be hazardous to pedestrians and a nuisance to pushchairs and wheelchairs.

Council asks that residents ensure the pavement adjacent to their driveway is regularly swept/kept clear of pebbles and/or pea shingle type materials.
