Green Spaces in the Parish

EPC reminds all parishioners to:

• Keep <u>dogs under control</u>. If your dog does not have excellent recall, it must be kept on a lead to ensure that it does not spoil the enjoyment of other parishioners.

Please Clean up after your dog!

Buckinghamshire Council is responsible for the emptying of the dog bins in Edlesborough, Dagnall and Northall. These are currently scheduled to be emptied on a Friday.

- If a bin is overflowing, please call the number on the bin and quote the reference number on the bin.
- If a bin is broken, please inform EPC as soon as possible to enable a swift repair or bin replacement, as necessary.
- Now that the evenings are darker, please be extra vigilant when walking your dog to ensure you clear up after them.

Thames Valley Police (TVP)

Planning Applications

Buckinghamshire Council have informed Council that they will no longer be relying on yellow site notices to publicise applications. Later in 2025 they will use neighbour notification letters to notify adjoining properties of applications. This is to align the approach to publicity with other areas in Buckinghamshire.

Site notices shall only therefore be put up in certain instances, where triggered by specific constraints.

As a result, parishioners can expect to see fewer site notices within the Aylesbury Vale area.

The responsibility for filling these bins is with Transport for Buckinghamshire. When supplies are running low a refill request should be submitted via their website https://www.fixmystreet.buckscc.gov.uk/ It is more



appropriate if a parishioner living close to the salt bin makes the request but in practice anyone can make the request.
